The Office of the New York State Attorney General (OAG) is seeking an experienced attorney to lead its <u>Criminal Appeals & Federal Habeas Corpus Bureau</u> (CAFHC). The selected candidate will supervise the work of CAFHC's 11 attorneys and 4 support staff. This position is located in New York City and reports to the Solicitor General of New York.

CAFHC represents the State in all appellate litigation arising from criminal prosecutions brought by the OAG, including cases brought by the Public Integrity Bureau, the Financial Crimes Bureau, the Organized Crime Task Force, and the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit. CAFHC also responds to federal habeas corpus petitions bringing constitutional challenges to state court convictions obtained by district attorneys throughout the state, as well as challenges to state parole determinations and other state action that results in custody. CAFHC provides advice and counsel on criminal matters to prosecutors and others throughout the Office. Attorneys in CAFHC draft briefs and motion papers, and present arguments in all federal and state trial and appellate courts throughout New York.

Suitable applicants should possess the following qualifications:

- At least ten (10) years post-graduate legal experience that includes prior New York State criminal appellate experience; clerkship experience is preferred but not required;
- At least three (3) years of experience supervising and leading attorneys and support staff with the

- demonstrated ability to foster a collegial and productive working environment;
- Excellent oral advocacy, legal analysis, legal research, legal writing and editing skills;
- Strong organizational, interpersonal communication, problem-solving, and teamwork skills; and
- Comfort with and proficiency at using technology and various software programs to complete logal work.

Applicants must reside in (or intend to soon become a resident of) New York State and be admitted to practice law in New York State. In addition, the Public Officers Law requires that attorneys in the Office be citizens of the United States. A two (2) year commitment upon being hired is a condition of employment.

The salary range for this position is \$168,419 - \$183,927 + \$3,026 in location pay. The final salary will be set after a complete evaluation of the selected candidate's qualifications. As an employee of the OAG, you will join a team of dedicated individuals who work to serve the people of our State through a wide variety of occupations.
