The University at Buffalo School of Law invites applications for the position of Lecturer in Law in its Legal Analysis, Writing, and Research (LAWR) Program, which provides intensive skills training with a strong emphasis on small-group and individual learning.

The position is a full-time 12-month University appointment for an initial period of two years, beginning in the summer of 2024, with an assumption that at least one subsequent three-year appointment will follow. The possibility of renewing the appointment after the initial five years is assumed. One position will be filled at a salary of \$75,000 to \$80,000 per year.

The Lecturer will teach one section of LAWR each semester, will prepare their own lesson plans and assignments, and are encouraged to collaborate with other LAWR faculty. Applicants must: (1) have a J.D. degree from an ABA-approved law school; (2) have at least two years full-time practice experience in a U.S. state or territory; (3) be a current or former member in good standing of the bar in a U.S. state or territory; and (4) demonstrate an outstanding level of achievement in legal research and writing, either during law school or in practice. Prior experience teaching legal writing is preferred but not mandatory, and experience working with international students or in academic support will be viewed favorably but is not required.
