Monroe County Hall of Justice to Host Job and College Fair

ROCHESTER, NEW YORK—Administrative Judge William K. Taylor today announced that the Monroe County Hall of Justice, with the support of the City of Rochester, Action for A Better Community, and local businesses and other organizations will host a Job and College Fair on Tuesday, October 8, 2024, from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm.

The Fair will be open to all who have business in or visit the courthouse that day. Representatives from participating entities will be stationed that day at display tables on the first floor of the courthouse—at **99 Exchange Blvd.**, **Rochester**, **NY**—to offer information and assistance to Fair visitors about local college programs, job readiness training, and employment openings. This year, graduating high school seniors from the Rochester Central School District and Vertus High School will be at the Fair to engage with prospective employers, including attending a presentation by Unified Court System employees to learn about the many career paths offered by the New York State Courts. Participating entities include Monroe Community College, AmeriCorps, the Rochester Police Department, BLE Training and Employment, and the League of Women Voters, among others.

"Due to the success of our initial Job and College Fair, launched last year, the Monroe County Hall of Justice will once again join with the City of Rochester and other sponsors to host a Fair to connect locals with representatives from area colleges, businesses, and organizations to explore educational and job opportunities," said Judge Taylor. "I am thankful to our sponsors and participating organizations and especially grateful to Rochester City Court Judge Van White, whose goal in first proposing the idea for the fair was to build stronger bridges with the community and provide a venue where residents can avail themselves of local opportunities and resources. I am thrilled that, for the second year in a row, we are bringing that vision into reality."
